

Options at The Wilnecote School

Changes to Key 4 for September 2024

- Curriculum review Key stage 4 based on staff and student consultation, historic outcomes – basics, EBACC, subject performance, pupil progress.
- Additional time for English
- Additional time for Science
- Three options blocks instead of four
- Maintain the academic rigour expected of a school that is ambitious for its students and the importance of non-core subjects and choice
- Further enhance the wider development of our students



Options at The Wilnecote School

- As a school we are committed to providing our students with a broad and balanced key stage 4 curriculum which builds upon skills and knowledge developed and gives them effective progression routes into post-16 education or training.
- Our options process gives students a certain amount of flexibility and choice about the subjects they can study. We encourage students to consider all of the subjects that we offer and to make an informed choice based on their own strengths and interests.

 We want students to choose a range of subjects that will motivate them and provide them with an enjoyable experience suited to their individual learning needs.





Key Stage 4 Core Curriculum

Our Core curriculum is as follows:

- English Language and Literature
- Mathematics
- Trilogy Science (2 GCSE's)
- Physical Education (statutory)
- PSHE (statutory)





The English Baccalaureate - EBACC

The English Baccalaureate (EBACC) is a set of subjects at GCSE that keeps young people's options open for further study and future careers. To be eligible for the EBACC students must study:

- English Language and Literature
- Maths
- The Sciences
- Geography or History
- A modern foreign language (French or German)

The EBACC is made up of subjects which are academic in profile

A study by the UCL Institute of Education shows that studying subjects included in the EBACC provides students with greater opportunities in further education and increases the likelihood that a pupil will stay on in full-time education. Sutton Trust research reveals that studying the EBACC can help improve a young person's performance in English and Maths.

The government's ambition is to see 90% of pupils studying the EBACC subject combination at GCSE by 2025.



Key Stage 4 Option Subjects

- Students will need to choose 3 optional subjects
- Student <u>must</u> choose one option from Option Block A



- Students must then choose an additional 2 subjects from Options Block B
- Students must then choose two reserves for option block B, ordering them in preference.
- Whilst we make every effort to give all students the opportunity to study their first option choices, this is not always possible due to class sizes and numbers opting for certain subjects.
- Therefore, we encourage all students to put a reserve choices that they would be interested in studying.
